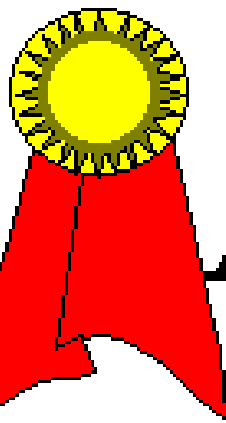

Maths Challenge

This week, we'd love you to spend some time with your child practising their number bonds. These are simply the pairs of numbers that can be added together to make a given number. For example, $1 + 9 = 10$, $2 + 8 = 10$, $3 + 7 = 10$ etc.

Have a chat with your child. Do they know their number bonds to 10, 20 or even 100? If this knowledge is secure, your child shouldn't have to work the pairs out, instead they should be able to recall them quite rapidly. How many fun ways can you and your child find to match pairs of numbers to practise number bonds?
