This Week's Highlights

- In Nursery we have listened to the story of "The 3 Little Pigs" and acted it out as we followed the story map. The children have talked about shapes as they have created printed houses and houses made from dough.
- In Reception we have been reading The Gruffalo. We have acted out the story and made our own story maps to help us re-tell the story. We have also enjoyed learning about the forest.
- Year 1 have worked hard this week on identifying 1 more and 1 less than given numbers within 20. They used resources, number lines and counted on/back in their heads!
- Year 2 have enjoyed lending their support to a little boy who was struggling with his homework this week-he needed to find out what the capital cities of the four countries in the UK were and the children were enthusiastically exploring the atlases they found in our school library to help.
- Year 3 have enjoyed their art work this week, based on Stone Age cave paintings. The children have been experimenting with different materials to create texture similar to that of a cave wall, and using charcoals to draw on top.
- Year 4 have enjoyed their science topic this week. They have constructed electrical simple series circuits and represented them using electrical symbols.
- Year 5 have been working hard researching about Roman Emperors, and presenting their findings using Microsoft PowerPoint.
- Year 6 have been really excited to take part in their art project this week. They have been making water cycle dioramas and have had a wonderful time. Ask your Y6 children to explain to you what a diorama is.

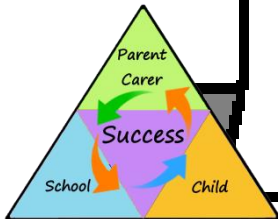
