- In Nursery this week we have continued with our Superhero topic, the children have enjoyed wearing the new capes and transforming into Superheroes in our Hero Lair.

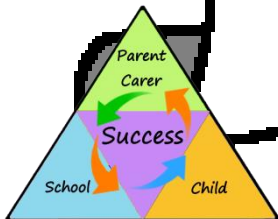
