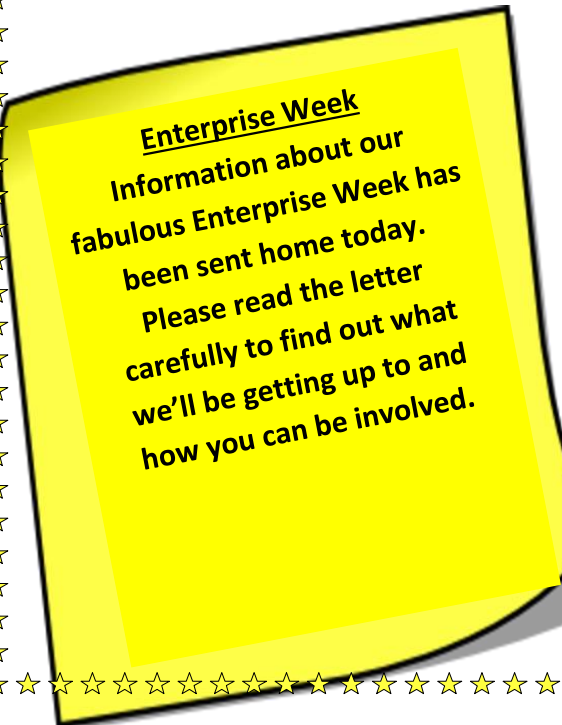


This Week's Highlights

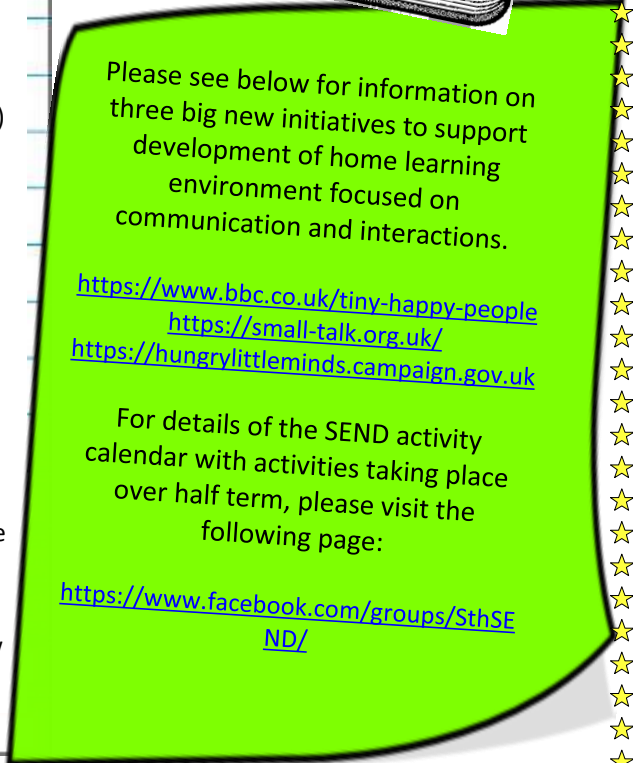
- Nursery children have had the story of Superworm and have been planning how they can save him from the Lizard and the Crow.
- In Reception, as well as being introduced to "Zog and the flying doctors", we have been learning more about Chinese New Year, carrying out dragon dancing, making clay rats and tasting some delicious food.
- Year 1 took part in a science experiment to identify waterproof materials. They made predictions before testing each material using water.
- Year 2 have enjoyed reading the Jungle Book and learning about the offspring of humans and animals. We traced Mowgli's development from baby to teenager then discussed what would happen when he became an adult then (hopefully) lived to become an elderly man.
- Year 3 have continued to enjoy our topic work on Tudor music and dance. We have explored how the dance styles of 400 years ago are very different to dance styles today.
- In science, Year 4 have been looking at living things and can identify and classify vertebrates by observing similarities and differences. They also enjoyed creating their own classification key. In history we have worked together to make sections of a Roman road as part of Power topic.
- In Year 5, we have started to compose our own Egyptian ceremonial music to honour the Egyptian God Osiris. So far, we have created a chant, a pulse and an ostinato.
- Year 6 have continued their learning on the human body. This week, we looked more closely at the digestive system and how it works.
