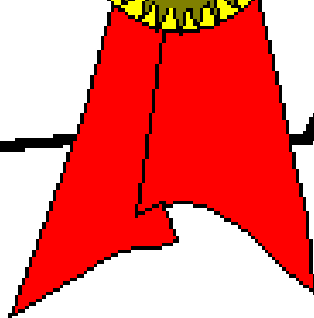

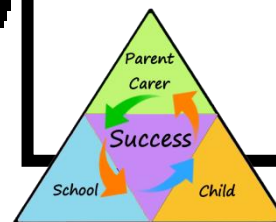
5 bananas cost £2
