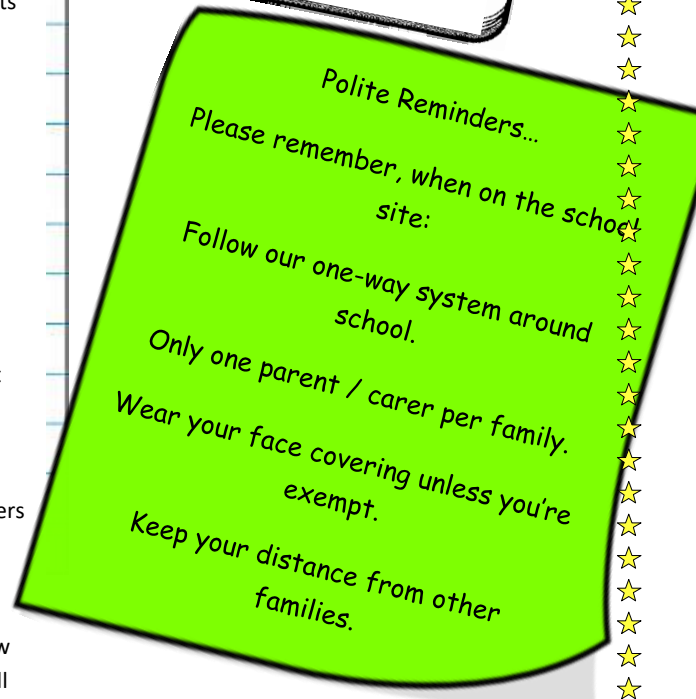
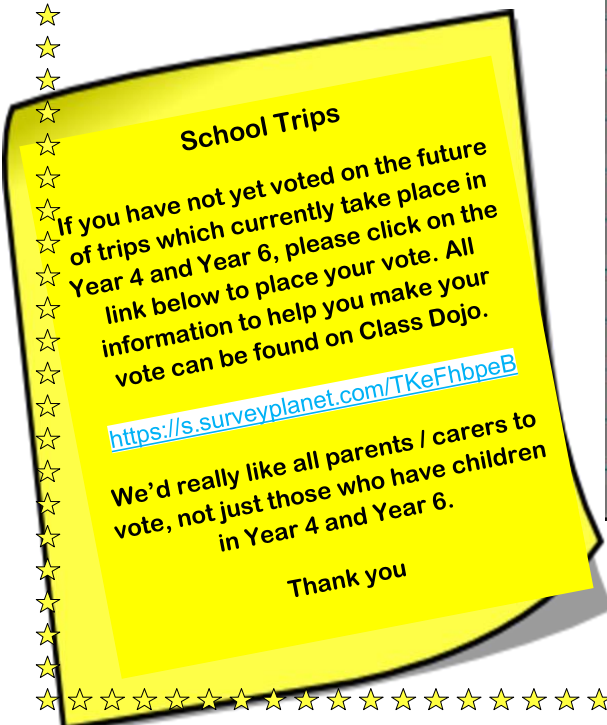




Allanson Street News

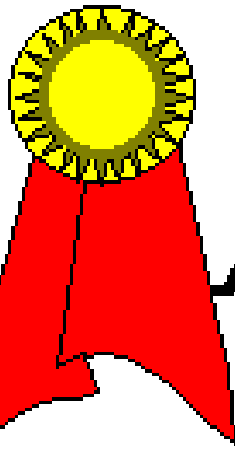
