This Week's Highlights

In **Nursery** we have started to learn about the season of Autumn and the children enjoyed exploring the school grounds, collecting leaves and other interesting Autumnal objects. We have also learned about Remembrance Day this week and that people wear a special flower – “poppy” to remember those that fought to protect us.

This week in **Reception**, we discussed the celebration of Bon-fire Night, sharing our experiences and traditions. We then began learning about the Forest in preparation for our trip to Delamere Forest. The children were amazingly behaved and enjoy their trip, learning new things along the way. We finished our week learning about the meaning of the poppy.

This week in **Year 1** we spent time learning about communities and how they worked together during WW1 to grow food so everyone could eat. We enjoyed using glockenspiels in Music. In maths, we have been exploring number bonds to 10. We loved using emojis to help explain how the characters in our story were feeling at different points in our story too.

Year 2 have been working hard this week to write their own diary entry to show their dream day in Australia. It has been lovely to see the improvement the children have made in their writing from September. The children have also been amazed by the differences in their lives today to the lives of children during WW1. We learned what the children had to do then and they thought about what job they would choose if they were alive during the war.

Year 3 have been working incredibly hard on their assessments this week, we are very proud of you all! Also, we have been learning about the role of women during WW1. We tried to imagine what it would have been like for young women who suddenly had to go and work on the farms as part of the Women's Land Army, or in a munitions factory, making shells and other weapons for the soldiers to use.

This week, **Year 4** have been working very hard on their assessments-well done! We have also spent time learning about the amazing courage and resilience of the soldiers in WW1, including the harsh reality of trench warfare and the importance of letters to and from home to boost morale and share news. The children have shown sensitivity and respect towards this important part of history and we are very proud of them!

This week, **Year 5** have been learning about some of the tactics used in WW1. They have found out how propaganda posters, trench warfare, tunnels and morse code were used as tactics throughout WW1. They have also produced some lovely pieces of art work including their own sketches of poppies using oil pastels and charcoal.

This week, **Year 6** have been thinking about the amazing people who fought and died in the War. We have looked at how the war started and the alliances were made. We have learned sports and countries in sign language and how blood travels around our circulatory system.

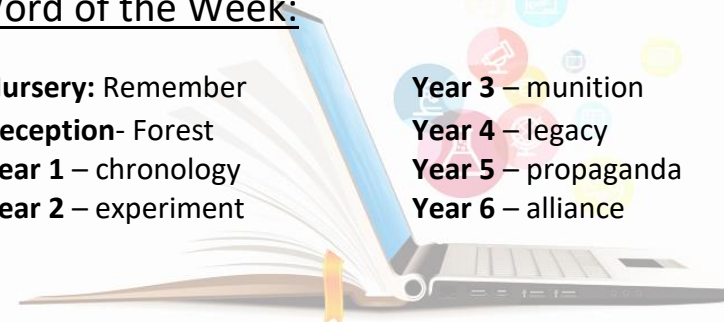
