

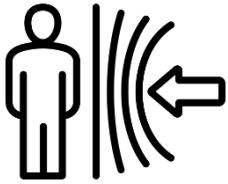

This Week's Highlights

This week in **Nursery**, we have listened to the story "What the ladybird heard", the children looked at the features of the map of the farm, leading them on to drawing their own maps. The children also had fun helping Mrs Abbott correct her 'mistake', she had mixed all the pictures up that showed their life cycle. They made sure that the life cycle of each creature was in the correct order and use the scientific words.

This week in **Reception**, we have used story maps to help us re-tell the story of The Three Little Pigs. We then wrote about our favourite part of the story. We have looked at different shapes and used problem solving skills in maths when playing our maths games. We have had our last dance session with Miss Lucy. Our teachers are very proud of our performing skills and how hard we have worked. We can't wait for more dance in Year 1.

This week in **Year 1**, we have written our diary entry as if we were a character from our book The Baddies. We had so much fun thinking about what our character did and how they were feeling. In Maths, we have started fractions and explored halves. Extreme weather fascinated us, and we enjoyed creating information posters to help people stay safe in the sun IF we have another heatwave!

Year 2 have been working hard this week to finish their DT structure of a treehouse. They have all done a great job thinking carefully about the joins they were using and making changes as they went to improve their products. The children have also worked hard to write a personification poem to make their readers think about the effects of global warming.

This week in **Year 3**, we have had a very busy week writing our biographies about Mary Anning, as well as continuing our work on time in maths! We also visited St. Peter's Church on Wednesday and had a guided tour of the church grounds so we could observe the different uses of rocks and see how they had weathered over time.

This week, in **Year 4** we have continued to learn about the lives of inspirational people to complete our unit on biography writing. The children also worked incredibly hard in art and have now learned how to draw a bird step by step. We must also say a HUGE well done to all of those children who showed such courage and determination in their swimming assessments this week and their performances in our wonderful talent show. We are incredibly proud of you!

Year 5 have enjoyed starting our new English topic about Malala. The children have been amazing at describing how they would have a positive impact and make a true difference is they also had a magic pencil. In Science, we have continued to make an observation over time. We have watched how a mint plant can be reproduced using propagation.

Year 6 have been working so hard on some amazing non-chronological reports all about Anne Frank and her diary. We have made a wonderful start to our Geography topic and learned all about how trade works. We have also made a very exciting start to our summer production.

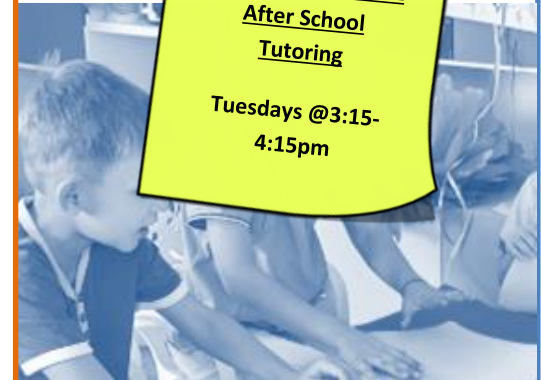
Reminders
